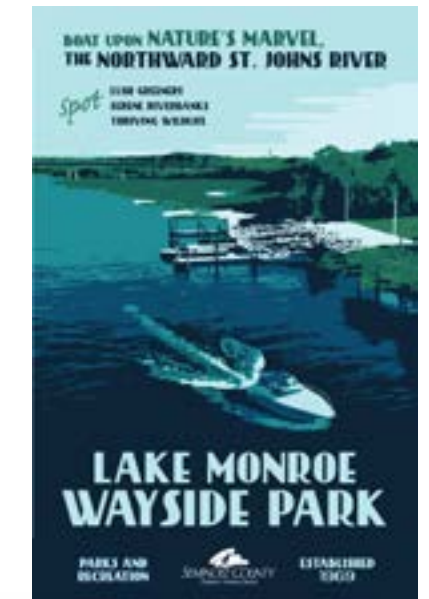
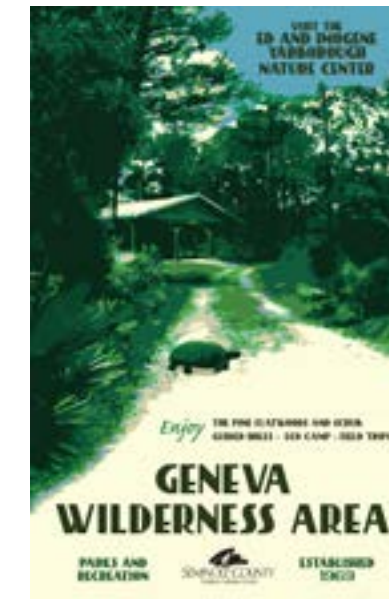
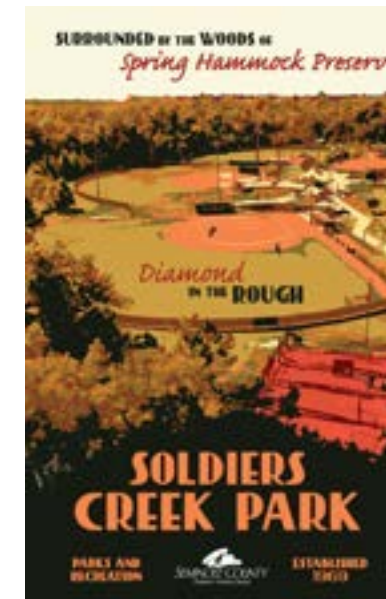
### Leadership Spotlight

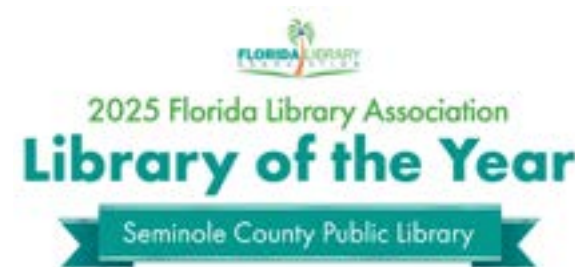


Library team recognized by the Board of County Commissioners

### Award-winning Library

The Seminole County Library System, part of the Parks and Recreation Department, has been named the **2025 Library of the Year** by the Florida Library Association. The award highlights the library system's summer reading challenges, STEAM programs, book clubs, and other initiatives that support learning and community engagement.

Additionally, the Seminole County Library System received the **2025 Innovative Program or Service Award** for its summer reading challenge, The Great Seminole County Adventure. The "Amazing Race"-style program, created in partnership with the Museum of Seminole County History, led to more than 580 visits to the library during summer 2024.

**What’s New at Spring  
Hammock Preserve and  
the Osprey Trailhead**

Big upgrades have come to the Osprey Trailhead at Spring Hammock Preserve.

The preserve, which spans roughly 1,500 acres on the west shore of Lake Jesup in Longwood, now features new boardwalks with bench seating, including one that extends to Lake Jesup. New mud walk crossings will also be part of the popular annual fifth-grade field trip for Seminole County students, known as the Mud Walk. Other improvements include an ADA-accessible pathway and a new pavilion.

The project was funded through the One Cent Infrastructure Sales Tax (Penny Sales Tax), the Natural Lands–Trails Bond Fund and the Land and Water Conservation Fund, administered through FDEP.

## YOUTH PROGRAMS

### Tennis ♥

#### Junior Development Program

The Junior Development Program helps beginner players learn the sport! Players will develop a foundation in all tennis strokes as well as athletic skills, coordination, and footwork. Certified tennis professionals will use United States Tennis Association (USTA) teaching methodology and concepts and create a fun-focused learning environment.

#### Age Groups:

- 3 & 4 year olds (36' court, foam balls, 19" & 21" rackets)
- 5 & 6 year olds (36' court, red compression balls)
- 7 & 8 year olds (60' court, red and orange balls)
- 9 & 10 year olds (60' court, orange and green dot balls)
- 11+ year olds (full court, regular balls and rackets)

**Locations:** Red Bug Lake Park, Sanlando Park and Sylvan Lake Park

#### Cost:

- Weekday Group Classes 4 or 5 week sessions \$36 or \$45
- \$36 (Saturday group lessons held one hour per week for 4 weeks)
- \$72 (Saturday group lessons held one hour per week for 8 weeks)

#### Junior Training Program

The Junior Training Program is for intermediate-level youth players ready to develop skills for playing on a school team or in tournaments. The daily format combines instruction with practice, structured drills, and match play, and follows USTA techniques. Participation is based on ability and may be subject to the tennis pro's approval.

## ADULT PROGRAMS



### Tennis ♥

Tennis is the sport of a lifetime and you are never too old to start. Get some cardiovascular exercise while learning skills and meeting other players. Certified professionals make tennis lessons fun for players of all abilities, from beginners to those looking for strategic competition.

#### Levels:

- **Beginner:** Grips, footwork, forehand and backhand groundstrokes, volleys and serve will be introduced.
- **Intermediate:** Participants will focus on coordinating movement and balance, hitting the ball with purpose and direction, and improvement of their skill level through strengthening of the fundamentals learned in the beginner level.
- **Advanced:** Emphasis will be on incorporating skills into playing situations. Top spin and slice will be introduced. Drills and playing situations to include ball movement and control of varying ball speeds with shot anticipation.
- **Strategy:** Singles and Doubles. Improve your match results and competitive tennis experience. Doubles to include serve and volley, poaching moving as a team, return strategy and different formations. Learn the different styles of play and find out what type of game you want to perfect!

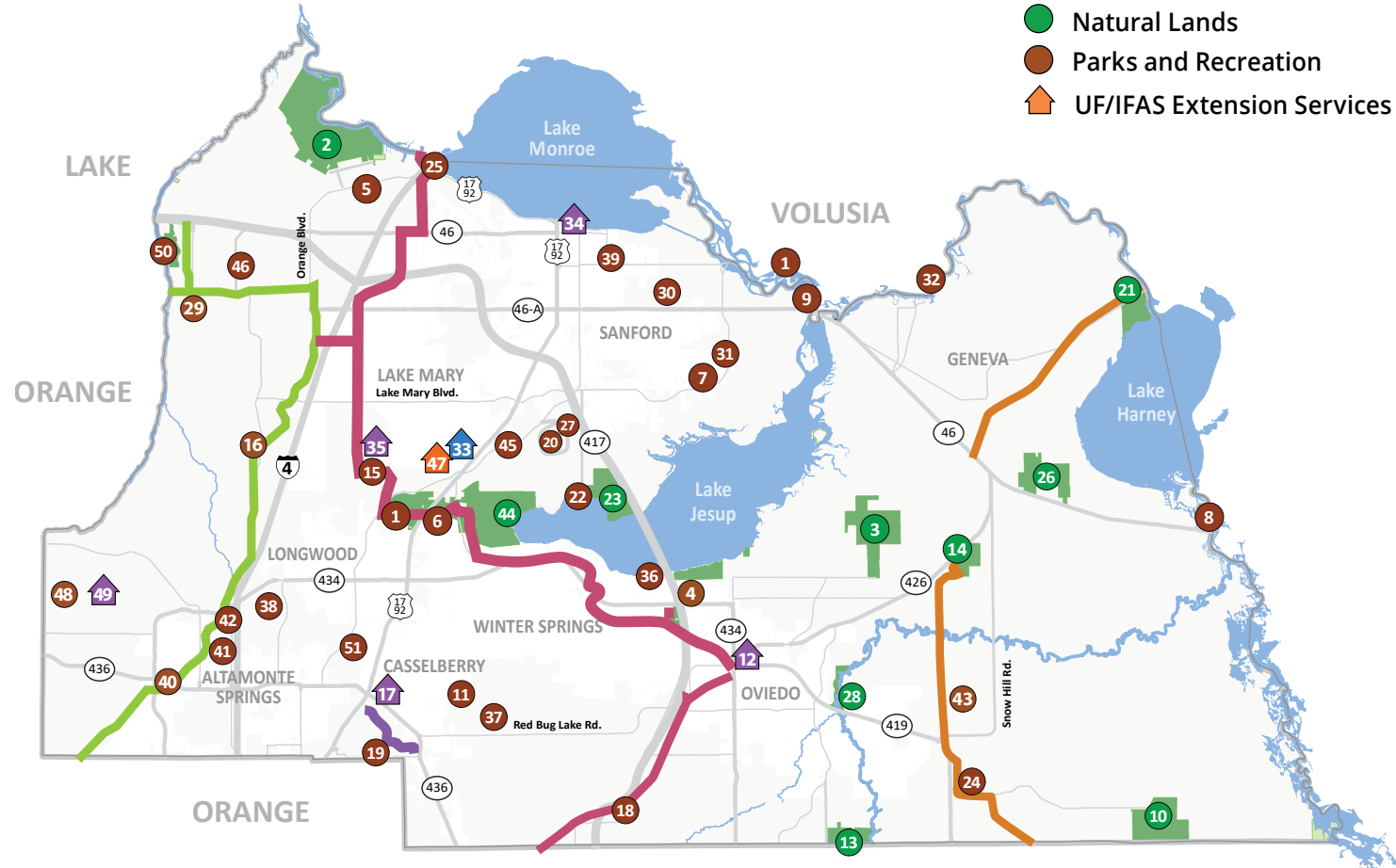

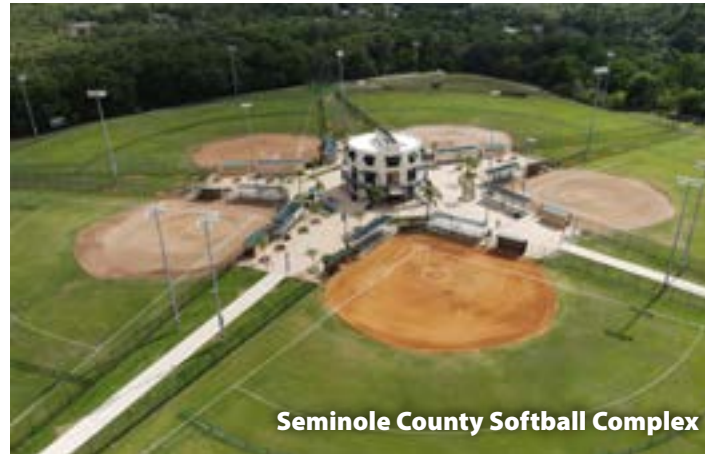
